This week we were delighted to finally receive our **Ofsted** report and **GOOD** judgement which (at last) we have been able to share this with you. It has been a very long wait! We hope that you feel as pleased and as proud as we do. There were many positive aspects commented upon: our children– their enthusiasm for learning, good behaviour, respectful relationships, varied and broad curriculum, good leadership, as well as 'the caring, happy and cohesive ' that we have all strived so hard to create and maintain. Much good news to celebrate and build upon this year, as well as in the years to come.

Reception children are becoming more used to their new classroom and school environment. They are already showing us many good learning behaviours, for example listening and responding to the staff and each other whilst they explore their new environment through first hand experiences and play. This week they had their first school dinners and played with the other children at lunch time. Next week Reception will stay all day so normal drop off and collection arrangements 8.45–3.10pm.

Update on the New Build-photo

This week the builders were finishing off the foundations and preparing the area ready for the brick layers who will arrive on site shortly. Swimming Lessons: Thursday (weekly)

We are pleased to tell you that we have been able to secure swimming lessons again at Great Dunmow pool which will continue throughout the year. Lessons will be offered to Y2, Y3 and Y4/5- one class per term. Y2 will start in the autumn term and a separate ParentMail will be sent in this regard. As a school we have to pay for the hire of the pool, the swimming teachers and life guard which is very costly. The government do not allow schools to use their Sports Premium Funding to pay for this, therefore, it has to be paid out of our main delegated budget. As a result, we do ask parents for a contribution to pay for the cost of the return coach journey to cover this additional cost. The school is able to support families on low incomes where certain criteria is met. Please refer to the main ParentMail information when received and if you have any queries or concerns, please speak to a member of the office team or Mrs Barron in confidence.

Parent Helpers/ Volunteers

There are many occasions throughout the year that we need your help, e.g. as escorts for various trips and local visits, in school to help support learning, e.g. hearing readers, or with practical activities, e.g. art or cookery. Volunteers make a huge difference to the life of our school and the opportunities that we are able to offer our children. Polite Reminders

Safety:

<u>Pedestrians</u>: Please always **use the path** when entering or leaving the site and not exit via the car park on foot.

Drivers: Please park safely and responsibly on the road without obstructing the driveways or access to local residents' properties/ garages. Please park further down the road from the school and avoid, stopping, turning or reversing in front of the school. This is a very busy place for children and adults crossing. Very young children often run or scoot ahead of their parents and we would like to avoid a nasty accident occurring.

Attendance/sickness absence:

If your child is off school, please ring on the first day of absence **BEFORE 9.15am**. If we have not heard from you we will activate our 'First Day Call' procedure. If your child should get sickness and/or diarrhoea then they should be clear for **48 hours** from the last episode, before returning to school.

Punctuality/ drop off & collection:

The gates and class doors open at 8.45am each day (15 mins early) to ease congestion. The gates are locked at 9am. We would kindly ask you to be prompt. Latecomers must enter via the main office and provide a valid reason for late arrival (which is a legal duty placed upon schools). At drop off time: KS2 children should say goodbye to their parents in the main playground; please only go around to the class door if you have a message for the teacher. KS1 parents may drop off and collect at the class door (please keep the entrance way clear). Reception parents may come into the class to help settle their child/ make a lunch choice but please leave the site by 9am so that we can secure eth site and begin the day's learning. Reception: Elgar & Beethoven: What a rocking start to the first few weeks at school! We are so pleased that they have settled really well. This week in reception the children have been enjoying reading 'Pete the cat- Rocking in my school shoes' by Eric Litwin. The children have designed and created their own guitars as well as decorating shoes and perfecting their air guitar moves. They have thought about what they like to do in their school shoes and have made their own shoe designs. Please do come and see our displays during drop off times to see for yourself!



Year 1: Welcome back Year 1, what a busy year ahead and already the children have faced the first two weeks with such positive attitudes. Keep this up! In Maths Y1 have been looking at representing numbers using pictorial representations and objects. In English they have been looking at this term's author and the story 'The Gruffalo'. Y1 started the week by focusing on sentence structure and then furthered their learning by looking at adjectives to describe the Gruffalo. The children also took part in our very first cheerleading session with our local partnership sports and dance specialist where they learnt the sequence for our competition in December.

Year 2: The children have started the history focus topic and have begun to learn about Mary Seacole. In English, Y2 looked at the features of a chronological report and began to write their own. In maths Y2 learnt about place value, using equipment to make numbers and to partition numbers.

Year 3: This week, Year 3 have been learning about place value in Maths. In PE, they had not one, but two external sports coaches teach them. On Monday, they began to learn about tag rugby and on Wednesday, they learnt a cheerleading routine for our local sports partnership upcoming cheerleading competition in December. We hope to also perform this to you later in the term.



Year 4/5: Wow! What a week! Britten class have been full of enthusiasm for learning this week. We have started some really tricky work which they have taken in their stride. We have also had a lot of fun getting to know each other. We started the week with a classroom treasure hunt, researching our Greek table names, class bingo and building the best structure from spaghetti and Marshmallows. Looking forward to the weeks ahead!
