Polite Reminders Safety:

Pedestrians:

Please always **use the path** when entering or leaving the site and not exit via the car park on foot.

Drivers:

Please park safely and responsibly on the road without obstructing the driveways or access to local residents' properties/ garages. Please park further down the road from the school and avoid, stopping, turning or reversing in front of the school. This is a very busy place for children and adults crossing. Very young children often run or scoot ahead of their parents and we would like to avoid a nasty accident occurring.

Attendance/sickness absence:

If your child is off school, please ring on the first day of absence **BEFORE 9.15am**. If we have not heard from you we will activate our 'First Day Call' procedure. If your child should get sickness and/or diarrhoea then they should be clear for **48 hours** from the last episode, before returning to school.

Punctuality/ drop off & collection: The gates and class doors open at 8.45am each day (15 mins early) to ease congestion. The gates are locked at 9am. We would kindly ask you to be prompt. Latecomers must enter via the main office and provide a valid reason for late arrival (which is a legal duty placed upon schools). At drop off time: KS2 children should say goodbye to their parents in the main playground; please only go around to the class door if you have a message for the teacher. KS1 parents may drop off and collect at the class door (please keep the entrance way clear). Reception parents may come into the class to help settle their child/ make a lunch choice but please leave the site by 9am so that we can secure eth site and begin the day's learning. Many thanks for your cooperation.

Dental/eye appointments

General check ups. These should be booked for outside the school day or during school holidays.

Medical/hospital appointments:

If this occurs during the school day, please let us know in advance and provide us with the letter/ appointment card so that we may copy it for the records. On the day, come to the main office to sign your child out.

LEARNING NEWS:

ARE booklets and curriculum leaflets for all year groups are now on the class pages of the website.

This term there are new curriculum leaflets for Reception and Y4/5.

Reception: Elgar & Beethoven: This week Reception have been learning all about Diwali. The children have manipulated clay to make their own diva lamps, then they used tools to create patterns and added paint to decorate them. In maths the children have been sorting and classifying different objects and comparing the size of the groups. Today they all enjoyed the outdoor learning at Forest School.

Year 1: This week Year 1 have been looking at subtraction and how this can be represented in different ways. The children started the week off by using concrete apparatus to represent different subtraction calculations, physically taking away the amount. They then moved on to looking at subtraction stories (word problems) and how to write these as a calculation. After securing the 'stem sentences' the children looked at variation and representing the subtraction stories in multiple ways. Finally they applied our their learning by answering subtraction word problems. Well done everyone!

Year 2: This week the children have continued to look at recipes identifying the main features of instructions in order to invent their own recipe. In maths the children have looked at a how to calculate *difference* in a range of different formats and are now adding and subtracting one from any 2 digit number. In computing, the children have also leant how to program turtles to perform two actions.

Year 3: In Science this week, Mozart class learnt about friction. They tested the distance that toy cars would travel on different surfaces. After the experiment, the children realised that each group had different results so



they discussed the factors (variables) that may have caused this. Following this, in ICT, the class recorded their results in a bar chart using the iPads and laptops. In English, the class learnt about instructions; one of the tasks was to perform a set of instructions about how to catch a dragon. In Maths, the children were learning how to find the nearest 10 and 100 in order to round numbers; next week they will use and apply this skill to estimate answers.



Year 4/5: This week the class have started a wonderful new book, Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo. The literacy work has been based around this book exploring expectations and predictions. The children have also looked closely at the characters and how to portray them in a drama lesson. The class look forward to next week as they have finished on quite a cliff-hanger! In art the children learnt about Japanese script and had a go at writing their name using Japanese characters.
