Polite Reminders

Safety:

Pedestrians:

Please always **use the path** when entering or leaving the site and not exit via the car park on foot.

Drivers:

Please park safely and responsibly on the road without obstructing the driveways or access to local residents' properties/garages. Please park further down the road from the school and avoid, stopping, turning or reversing in front of the school. This is a very busy place for children and adults crossing. Very young children often run or scoot ahead of their parents and we would like to avoid a nasty accident occurring.

Attendance/sickness absence:

If your child is off school, please ring on the first day of absence **BEFORE 9.15am**. If we have not heard from you we will activate our 'First Day Call' procedure. If your child should get sickness and/or diarrhoea then they should be clear for **48 hours** from the last episode, before returning to school.

Punctuality/ drop off & collection: The gates and class doors open at **8.45am** each day (15 mins early) to ease congestion. The gates are **locked** at **9am**. We would kindly ask you to be prompt. Latecomers must enter via the main office and provide a valid reason for late arrival (which is a legal duty placed upon schools). At drop off time: KS2 children should say goodbye to their parents in the main playground; please only go around to the class door if you have a message for the teacher. KS1 parents may drop off and collect at the class door (please keep the entrance way clear). Reception parents may come into the class to help settle their child/ make a lunch choice but please leave the site by 9am so that we can secure the site and begin the day's learning. Many thanks for your cooperation.

Dental/eye appointments

General check ups. These should be booked for outside the school day or during school holidays.

Medical/hospital appointments:

If this occurs during the school day, please let us know in advance and provide us with the letter/ appointment card so that we may copy it for the records. On the day, come to the main office to sign your child out.

LEARNING NEWS:

Reception: Elgar & Beethoven: Reception have been learning how to jump in different ways in their P.E. sessions this half term. They have practiced creating sequences of jumps using different apparatus and equipment to jump off, over or into. This week they had to add a balance to their sequence, taking time and trying to hold the balance for a count of three.



Year 1: Year 1 had an excellent opportunity of taking part in a science activity with a STEM ambassador linked to their science topic. The session started with the children learning the terms carnivore, herbivore and omnivore. Afterwards the children completed some sorting and classifying activities where each child was given an animal that they had to put it into the correct container based on what the animal ate. By the end of the session everyone was able to confidently name the three groups and could give an example of an animal for each group. In maths this week, Year 1 have continued their learning on subtraction, starting off with the cumulative law where they learnt that $10-7=3$ is the same as $3+10=13$. They used lots of practical apparatus such as number lines and reinforced the strategy of 'jumping back' for subtraction sums. They then had to use their knowledge to complete learning challenges.

Year 2: This week the children have been learning to add a single digit number to a two digit number using known number facts. In literacy we have started to learn a story about Chan and the Magic Brush linking to the topic on China. The children have also been studying famous artists, such as Picasso, and had a go creating a portrait in a cubist style. In ICT they have learnt how to use the timer and repeat commands using them in their own simple programs.

Year 3: The STEM ambassador, Jennie, was a scientist in the past so she was very knowledgeable. The session provided Mozart class with a chance to be introduced to magnets. The children started by exploring the magnets and working out what happens when you put certain ends (poles) together. Other activities included creating a race track and comparing different magnets. All the children were excited and they all enjoyed the morning of science activities. Lots of learning took place and they described the session as 'really fun!'



Year 4/5: Year 4 and 5 would like to say a big thank you to all the children, teachers and parents for getting on board with the Children in Need day. They are thrilled to have chosen this year's events and very much enjoyed seeing all the costumes and efforts made to support such a worthy cause. Thank you.
